MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR



Although most of us look forward to escaping the winter weather and welcome the arrival of spring, we can't forget the severe weather that it brings. In the past there has been confusion as to what the outdoor warning sirens mean and when one should take "cover". The Kenton County Warning Siren Policy states that the Outdoor Warning Sirens shall be activated for "Severe Weather" when one of the following events occur:

- ⇒ a tornado warning has been issued for Kenton County by the National Weather Service
- ⇒ the sighting of a funnel cloud or tornado has been reported by a trained public safety person
- ⇒ the sighting of a funnel cloud or tornado has been reported by a non-trained public safety person, in which the sighting has been confirmed by the closest law enforcement agency

According to this policy, persons hearing the outdoor warning system should "Take Cover, Tune In, and Take Action." It is always good practice to have flashlights and an emergency weather radio available for when storms do occur. Fire drills have always been encouraged, so why not practice tornado drills as well? It is important to have a plan when a storm strikes, including knowing where to take cover.

The City's Clean-up Erlanger committee continues to tackle blight issues in our community. Their goal is to help maintain Erlanger as a beautiful city that residents and businesses can enjoy. Spring brings on the desire for many to "get rid of the old". Please remember that Kenton County Public Works Department has a monthly clean-up program. ERLANGER PUBLIC WORKS BY DIRECTOR RICK BOGARD

With spring right around the corner, the Public Works Department is in full swing preparing for warm weather activities throughout the city. In particular, the majority of our team members will be focusing their attention on grass cutting in city owned parks/properties and along right of ways maintained by the city (totaling about 55 and a half acres).

With this in mind, we need your help as we enter into what can be a very busy season for us. Your extra eyes, ears and effort on the items listed below can go a long way in helping us maintain a good level of service delivery.

Storm Sewers/Heavy Rain Events: During the spring, we have the opportunity to experience heavy rainfall. Even though the City is no longer responsible for the ownership/maintenance of the underground portion of the Storm Sewer System, we act as a partner with Sanitation District #1 and have the responsibility for making sure that all entry points are free of debris and functioning. By following the few simple tips below taken from SD #1's website, you can help us, yourself and your neighbor from encountering any issues during a heavy rain event:

What property owners can do:

- Check and clean your private drains (such as driveway drains, area drains, gutters and downspouts) before a rain event, but be sure to check them after rain starts. While you may clear a grate or drain before an event, the rain may wash debris back over the grate which could cause flooding.
- If you notice that drains in the public right of way are covered or clogged, you can contact your city to ask them to clear the grate. You can contact me at 859-727-3893 to obtain a list of phone numbers for the cities.
- Make sure sump pumps are working (if applicable). Have a sump pump backup (such as a battery backup) should you lose power during a heavy rain storm.
- Make sure your private laterals (sanitary and/or storm water) are working properly and have a plumber inspect them periodically.
- When undertaking outdoor projects, try to choose materials that are not impervious which would increase surface water runoff.
- Call SD1 if there are any sinkholes or any signs of storm system failure, such as pipes coming apart.
- Do not discard debris, grass clippings, construction waste, trimmed tree branches or any other landscaping over hillsides or into wooded areas. This debris will eventually end up in drainage ditches and creeks, which could block inlets or outfalls causing flooding and impact water quality.
- If you see leaves, grass clippings, bottles, trash or other debris in front of a storm drain, please bag it before the next rainfall. Cleaning the surface of the storm drains in your neighborhood can help prevent flooding and protect your property.

Street Lights: Many of us remember growing up as a child and being told by our parents "be home by the time the street lights come on" during the summer months. My how times have changed, but street lights still play an important role in the safety and well being of our families and our community. As we come out of the winter months we often times have lights throughout the city that do not function properly because of various issues. If you know of a street light in your neighborhood that has not been working properly, please call us at (859) 727-3893 or visit our website to file a citizen survey request with the location of the light so we can contact the respective utility agency so proper repairs can be made.

<u>City Parks/Play Equipment:</u> If you see a safety or maintenance issue in any of the city owned parks, please contact us at (859) 727-3893 or contact us through our website to report the problem.

We regularly inspect all of our locations throughout the week, but sometimes problems arise in between those times that we need to be aware of.

Thanks in advance for your time and assistance and we hope that everyone has a safe spring!

Change Your Clock, Change Your Battery

The time of year has approached to change the batteries in your smoke detectors. Daylight Savings time occurred on March 10, 2013. Since our time has sprung forward, please keep in mind the safety of your home and your family. This is always a good time to change the batteries in your smoke and CO detectors.

Each year in March and November, the fire department teaches to change the batteries in your smoke detector and your CO detector. Even though you may not have dead or dying batteries in the detectors, the thought process is to have at least brand new batteries in there in case of an emergency. This insures that fresh batteries are in place and will sound your alarms as needed. The batteries that you take out of the detectors can be used in another way or in other items around the home. It is also a good time to go over some evacuation plans with your family in case a fire would occur.

After changing the batteries, hold in the test button and teach your family proper escape routes. Make sure there are several different ways out of the home in case one of the ways toward an exit is blocked. Make sure the family is crawling low under smoke and are able to think quickly. Be sure to include in the escape route the meeting spot outside the house. This is going to be the same location every time and insure that it is the only spot to go if a fire breaks out. Remember to practice fire safety by changing your batteries and also planning for things that might happen.

Go Right for Sirens and Lights

The City of Erlanger would like to remind all citizens of the proper actions to take when you encounter an emergency vehicle responding to an incident scene with its lights and sirens operating.

Being familiar with this information can keep you, other citizens, and the emergency responders safe and allow people in need to receive timely assistance.

There are times when the Police Department and Fire/EMS Department must respond quickly to an emergency to minimize the adverse effects that someone may be experiencing. If you are driving down the road and see an emergency vehicle with its lights and sirens on; **remain calm, move the vehicle to the right, and stop** to allow the emergency vehicle to continue. Be sure that the area to the right is safe for you to move into by checking your mirrors for vehicles and pedestrians. Once the emergency vehicle passes, cautiously merge back into traffic when it is safe to do so. Be sure to stay alert for other responders as well.

ADOPT-A -SCHOOL







Have you seen an increase in the police presence around your local school? Don't be concerned – nothing is wrong. A number of years ago the Erlanger Police Department started an "adopt a school" program. This has been reinstituted. This program assigns all of the officers to a school. Officers, no matter what shift, are to visit the schools, make contact with persons, check for locked doors, broken windows and overall just show an interest in their assigned school. This has several benefits. Officers become familiar with the school building and can easily notice if something is "just not right." The public will notice that officers are frequently at the schools which may deter them from coming to cause a problem. Students and staff members become familiar with the officers and are able to relay information that may assist in making the schools the safest they can be.

Why is this necessary if we have SRO's? The School Resource Officerss are assigned to Tichenor MS and Lloyd HS and only visit the elementaries in Erlanger if they are requested for assistance. They are busy handling issues, being law related counselors and law related instructors in their buildings. They also are only there during schools hours and school events. Our schools have the largest gathering of people in one place on a daily basis. Police presence could help avoid a potential tragedy such as what happened in Connecticut.

Items Needed When Applying For A Passport

- Evidence of U.S. Citizenship
 - Certified Birth Certificate (cannot be from a hospital)
 - Previously issued undamaged US Passport (minors must submit birth certificate in addition to passport)
 - Consular Report of Birth Abroad or Certification of Birth
 - Naturalization Certificate or Certificate of Citizenship
- Identification
 - Driver's license, State ID, Military ID, Passport (children need parents' ID)
 - Out of state applications must present a second ID (employment ID, voter registration card, student ID, credit card)
- 1 Picture (Must be 2"x2", Can be made at Walgreens, CVS, AAA, FedEx, Sam's)
- Application (Must be filled out in BLACK INK ONLY)
- Application Fee CHECK OR MONEY ORDER payable to "U.S. Department of State"
 - ONE CHECK PER APPLICATION (additional fees for expediting)
- Processing Fee Check, Money Order, MasterCard, Visa, or Discover payable to the CITY OF ERLANGER

Homestead Exemption Information

Am I Eligible?

Persons eligible for the Homestead Exemption must be at least 65 years of age. Proof of eligibility is required (driver's license, birth certificate, etc.) **YOU DO NOT HAVE TO WAIT UNTIL YOUR BIRTHDAY**. If you will turn 65 this year (2013) stop by the Kenton County Property Valuation Administrator now for this benefit.
