Although winter began with mild temperatures, harsher weather is sure to greet us in the near future. Our Public Works Department has strategized over the years and has come up with a plan that will make this winter much easier on those who live and work in Erlanger. Please remember that during snow emergencies you should not park on streets designated as "Snow Emergency Streets". Vehicles that are parked on these streets will receive a Parking Citation. Our Public Works crews cannot clear the snow and treat

the ice if vehicles remain parked on these streets. Erlanger has an Ordinance that states that a snow emergency can be declared or will be automatically put in place whenever there is an accumulation of snow or ice upon any portion of designated snow emergency streets in excess of two inches in depth. Erlanger does not issue Snow Emergency Levels, however, Kenton County does. To learn more about Kenton County's Snow Emergency Levels, please visit them at www.kentoncounty.org and type your request in the search area.

Inclement weather also causes potholes. To report a pothole, please call 727-2525 ext. 1. Your concern will be entered into our Citizen Request program and addressed.

NO. KY. 9-11 MEMORIAL

In February of 2011, the Crescent Springs Villa Hills Fire/EMS were presented with a piece of steel from the World Trade Center. Northern Kentucky representatives formed a committee to determine how to incorporate this piece of history to memorialize those who lost their lives on September 11, 2001. A decision was made to erect a monument at the Crescent Springs Community Park and named it the Northern Kentucky 9-11 Memorial to represent all Northern Kentucky communities.

FaceBook, Service Rating System, and Public Crime Mapping

On November 11, 2011 the Erlanger Police began using Face-Book to seek community assistance in identifying suspects or providing information to help solve open cases being handled by the Criminal Investigations Division. Detectives assigned to the CID will regularly make postings asking for assistance in solving cases. The Erlanger Police Department will also utilize the presence to promote community events, classes and other out reach programs. WASTE UPDATE

Republic Services (CSI) has gone automated in Erlanger! In an effort to improve their services and their employees' wellness, two automated trucks have been placed in Erlanger. These trucks have an arm that extends out and picks up your tote, lifting it in

the air, and dumping all trash into the top of the truck. The arm will pick up any type of waste container, whether it is the tote issued to you by Republic Services or one that you may have purchased. Items that are not in a tote or waste container will still be collected by the driver, provided that these items are not construction material, do not weigh over 50 lbs., and are not longer than 4 ft. Items containing bedbugs must be wrapped in plastic, including mattresses. Please remember to place all items in a bag before placing them in your tote. This will decrease the amount of liter that falls out of the totes when being emptied into the trucks. Please help to keep Erlanger clean!

FIRE MARSHAL NEEDS YOUR HELP



ADOPT- A-HYDRANT

The cold and snow season has arrived, so Erlanger Fire/EMS would like to suggest that you adopt the fire hydrant located in your yard or nearby. Please take a few extra minutes to shovel out the hydrant when you shovel your walk. Hydrants should have 3 feet of clearance around

them, whenever possible, to enable connection of the fire hoses. As always, if you notice a faulty hydrant that appears to be damaged or leaking, please contact the Northern Kentucky Water District at (859) 578-9898. Fire hydrants are vital to the operation of the fire department when your house is on fire. If hydrants cannot be located or are buried in snow, it is likely the fire will be much larger.

The Do's and Don'ts During a Winter Weather Event

Don't Park on the Street. Move your cars off the street on designated snow emergency routes and especially cul-de-sacs into the driveways when an accumulating snow is predicted. It is difficult to maneuver

trucks around on dry pavement let alone in icy conditions.

Do give plows & salt trucks room to maneuver. When applying salt and plowing snow they have to change lanes, back up, and make more frequent stops.

Don't pass trucks when salt is being applied/snow is being plowed. Keeping control of your vehicle can be extremely difficult.

Don't pull out into the intersection when snowplows are approaching. Drivers cannot control the snow coming off the plow blade. The snow often contains rocks and other debris from the roadway.

Don't shovel snow into the street when clearing sidewalks, driveways and parking lots. This makes clearing the roadway more difficult and creates more hazardous patches that require unnecessary retreatment.

Don't cover fire hydrants. If there is a fire hydrant at your curb – do not cover it with snow from your driveway or sidewalk. In the event of a fire emergency - this could help save a life by helping the fire department locate the hydrant more quickly.

Do be patient. When snow plow drivers clear residential streets; their plows **will** throw snow to the side and sometimes unintentionally into the entrances to driveways. This is an inconvenience that is unavoidable and always unintentional.

Do help your neighbor. If your neighbor needs help during a winter weather event, do what you can to help out. We all work better when we are working together.

Snow Removal and Emergencies

When inclement weather hits, the ten person operations staff of the Erlanger Public Works Department breaks down into two five person shifts to tackle conditions to the best of their abilities with the resources that they have available. They utilize four "work zones" during snow removal operations. With the 120 plus lane miles that they are tasked with taking care of, their target goal is to assign five trucks to the designated routes in the four work zones. Zones 1-3 have one truck assigned to the respective route in that zone and Zone 4 is divided into two routes (because of size) with one truck assigned to each respective route. They **do not** take care of **private drives or streets** within any portion of the city.

Within each zone are designated snow emergency routes that parking is prohibited on when a snow emergency is in place. By City of Erlanger Ordinance, a snow emergency can either be declared or is automatically in place whenever there is an accumulation of snow or ice upon any portion of designated snow emergency streets in excess of two inches in depth. To find out whether a snow emergency has been declared please view the school closing listings on Channels 5, 9, and 12, or go to our website or Facebook page. Vehicles that are not removed off designated snow emergency streets will be ticketed. The fine is \$25.00 which will double to \$50.00 if not paid within 7 business days. Our priority is not the income received, but to get the vehicles removed so that the streets can be addressed.
